Lunchbox idea - Gourmet egg and salad sandwich

1 hard-boiled egg, finely chopped

 $\frac{1}{4}$ celery stalk, finely sliced

1 small spring onion, finely sliced

2 tsp Parmesan cheese

1 tbsp dijonnaise

 $\frac{1}{4}$ cup baby spinach or rocket leaves

3 slices tomato

2 slices grainy bread (try soy and linseed)

Optional additions

Sliced red capsicum or bottled roasted capsicum, drained
Alfalfa sprouts
Grated carrot

Method

Combine eggs, celery, spring onion, cheese and mayonnaise in a bowl.

Lay bread on a board. Top one slice of bread with baby spinach or rocket, egg mixture and optional ingredients (if desired). Top with other slice of bread.

Tip

Egg mixture can be made ahead of time and in bulk, and refrigerated for up to two days.
