PLEASE NOTE:

- ✦ Shoes are compulsory for every event
- ✦ Children not competing are expected to be watching and cheering for their school
- ✦ No children to be on playground climbing equipment
- ✦ Please advise parents times listed for events are approximate and may vary by 10-15 minutes.

Qualifying Distances:

High jump: (these heights will be strictly enforced)

Minor boys	0.80 m	Minor girls	0.75 m
Junior boys	0.90m	Junior girls	0.85m
11yr boys	0.95m	11yr girls	0.90m
Snr boys	1.00m	Snr girls	0.95m

- ✦ A 1 metre square take off box will be marked at each end of the high jump stand
- ✦ All jumpers must have one foot in/on the square when they take off, otherwise it is a foul jump
- ✦ The Fosbrey Flop technique, where a jumper goes over the bar head/shoulders first, is no longer permitted by the Dunoon District PSSA due to the danger of jumpers landing on their head/neck/back
- ✦ All jumpers must utilise the scissors jump whereby they go over the bar feet first, landing on the feet or lower torso.
- ✦ A Solid Bar will be used for all divisions including minors.

Shot Put:

Minors	1kg	Juniors	2kg
11yr	2kg	Seniors	3kg

Turbo Jav:

Standard for all ages – junior, 11yr and seniors

Vortex:

Minors only.

Not all throws/jumps will be measured. Qualifying distances will be marked in each area.
