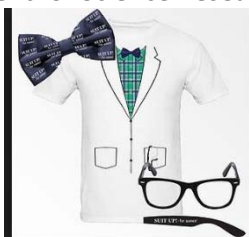
Hi everyone,

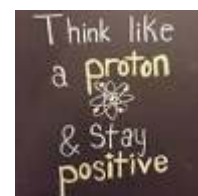
